PARKING

MCMASTER CAMPUS/MCMASTER UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER (MUMC)

To obtain parking for main campus you will need to visit McMaster Parking Services located in building T32 located near Lots N and P. There are several parking lot options available, however, many Faculty of Health Sciences employees choose to park at Ward Avenue.



MCMASTER IDENTIFICATION



On or before your start date, you will receive an email from Human Resources that will contain your MAC ID, Employee ID Number, Barcode number, and McMaster email address. You will need these to access various applications throughout the University.

MAC ID

Your MAC ID is a unique alpha-numerical identifier, enabling a single sign-on for a number of McMaster systems and applications, including email and Mosaic. You will need to activate your MAC ID using the MAC ID activation tool.

*Employees are reminded to always keep their Mac ID password private and secure.

EMPLOYEE ID

Your employee ID number is a unique nine-digit number used to identify you. This number works across the university and is the same as your McMaster student ID number.

BARCODE

The 14-digit number printed on your McMaster ID card is also your library barcode. This barcode number and pin (which you set the first time you log in) allow you to log into your library account to renew materials or request holds and recalls.



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PHOTO ID CARDS

The hospital and the university operate on two different systems.

University access cannot be added to a Health Science ID card and hospital access cannot be added to a Working at McMaster ID card. You may need to obtain both cards depending on where you need access.

FACULTY OF HEALTH SCIENCES PHOTO ID BADGE

If you require swipe access within an HHS building, including the McMaster University Medical Centre (MUMC), you will need to request a Faculty of Health Science (FHS) Photo ID badge. Please contact HR Link directly and cc your supervisor with your employee ID number along with a clear, recent picture of yourself. An HR representative will contact you via email once it is ready for pick up. Please contact the Staffing & Operations Administrative Assistant to have access added to your badge

WORKING AT MCMASTER PHOTO ID BADGE

The Working at McMaster Photo ID badge is free to any person employed by the University. This badge is required for employees who need access the Michael DeGroote Center for Learning (MDCL). Please contact axiomrep@mcmaster.ca directly with your MacID to obtain your badge. Please contact the Staffing & Operations Administrative Assistant to have access added to your badge.

PHOTO REQUIREMENTS

- Be recent and similar to a passport photo (head shot only, looking straight into the camera)
- Have a neutral or smiling expression
- Be in colour, in focus and of good quality (scanned photos of your driver's license, passport or health card are not acceptable)
- Be on an uncluttered background and of you alone (no other people or animals permitted in photo)
- Not contain props (i.e. hats, sunglasses or graduation caps)

CMCB ACCESS

The <u>Centre for Microbial Chemical Biology</u> (CMCB) is a research core facility associated with the Michael G. DeGroote Institute for Infectious Disease Research. The facility features six integrated labs that provide research support, hands-on training, and services in chemistry and biology. The CMCB is available for use by both academic and industrial clients.

To obtain CMCB access you must:

- Obtain your Working at McMaster ID badge.
- Provide an up to date copy of your safety training to validate that all required training is complete and current.
- · Request training on an equipment item.
- Complete a safety walk-through of the facility.
- Receive in person training on the equipment.

Once you can demonstrate a base level of proficiency using the equipment on independently, access will be granted.

MCMASTER MAIL

McMaster Mail is the email and calendar service in the Outlook environment, powered by Microsoft (Office 365). This service is provided to all staff and faculty members.





MICROSOFT 365

McMaster provides Office 365 at no cost for all employees. Applications that are currently available include MS Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, Teams and Outlook (McMaster Mail).





Z00M

Zoom is a video communications app that allows you to set up virtual video and audio conferencing, webinars, etc. This service is free for all McMaster employees. Sign in with your McMaster email and your MAC ID password to activate your zoom license account.



MOSAIC



Mosaic is McMaster's administrative information system which includes finance, human resources and student administration components. **Employees can use Mosaic to access** their pay stub, T4's, request vacation days and sign up for training courses.



MAC WIFI & VPN



There are many ways to connect to the various McMaster WiFi networks. UTS provides step-by-step instructions for different operating systems and devices.

McMasters VPN Software (Virtual Private Network) allows you to connect to the campus network from an off-campus computer. VPN is no longer required for things like remote library access.

COMPENSATION



Upon hire as a McMaster employee, you will complete a Direct Deposit Form. Earnings will be deposited directly into the account specified by your Employee Contact & Deposit form. For direct deposit you will require an account at a Canadian bank, credit union or trust company. Pay cheques will be deposited biweekly on Fridays.



To view or print pay stubs, login to Mosaic using your MAC ID and select 'Pay' on your homepage. Pay statements are available on Thursday, prior to the pay deposit. Please see the Viewing your Pay Statement Guide for more information. If you have questions about your pay cheque please contact the Staffing & Administrative Operations Administrative Assistant.

T4 TAX SLIPS

T4 tax slips can be downloaded in Mosaic through the Employee Self Service Tile and visiting the employee self-service section.

McMaster University also sends the T4's directly to the Canada Revenue Agency.

BENEFITS & LEAVES

ELIGIBILITY

Postdoctoral Fellows are encouraged to participate in the 'Working at McMaster' program and other health promotion activities available to all McMaster employees. PDFs may be eligible for additional health benefits if they have an appointment of 12 months or longer, and this eligibility will be noted in your Offer Letter from Human Resources. If you have any questions about your benefit eligibility or your enrolment, please contact your Human Resources representative.



If you are eligible to receive additional health benefits through the University's insurance provider, Sun Life (as indicated in your letter of offer), your qualified dependents will also be eligible to receive these benefits. According to Sun Life, your dependent must be your spouse or your child and a resident of Canada or the United States and maintaining provincial health coverage (or University Health Insurance Plan coverage).

The benefit year runs from July 1st to June 30th. In order to have your claims processed, Sun Life must receive your claim prior to the September 30th following the end of the benefit year in which the claims were incurred. Most benefit claims can be submitted online directly to Sun Life for instant processing through My Sun Life. If you need to mail a claim, you can download a paper claim from the links.

DENTAL



If your appointment is for 12 months or longer, you are eligible to enroll in dental insurance. The McMaster Dental Care Plan provides coverage for a wide range of dental services, from your regular check-ups to major procedures such as root canals and crowns. These procedures must be provided by a licensed Dentist, Denturist, Dental Hygienist and/or Anaesthetist. Should you choose to participate in this plan, you will be responsible for a portion of the cost of this coverage with deductions made through the University payroll system.

However, if your appointment is funded through another source or granting agency, you will be required to provide McMaster with post-dated cheques to cover the cost of the dental insurance premium for the duration of your Fellowship appointment. You will have the opportunity to enroll in this plan during your Welcome Meeting with FHS Human Resources. For more information, please refer to your Sun Life benefit bookle

EMPLOYEE AND FAMILY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

If you hold an appointment for 12 months or longer, you have access to McMaster's <u>Employee and Family Assistance Program</u>
(EFAP). McMaster's EFAP, Telus Health, is a professional service that provides easy access to mental, physical, social and financial wellbeing supports. Telus Health is Canada's most expansive clinical network: those who need support or resources can access them through phone, in-person visits, video, an online chat feature and self-guided learning.

GROUP LIFE INSURANCE

If your appointment is for 12 months or more you are eligible to participate in the University's basic group life insurance plan. The premium costs for this plan will be paid by the University. The purpose of this benefit is to assist your beneficiary in the event of your death while employed at McMaster University. You will enroll in group life insurance during your Welcome Meeting with FHS Human Resources.



OPTIONAL GROUP LIFE INSURANCE

If your appointment is for 12 months or more you are also eligible to purchase additional life insurance through the Optional Life Insurance Plan. You will be responsible for premiums associated with the optional group life insurance. The cost of coverage is based on your completed Health Statement form, which will be assessed by Sun Life. You will have the opportunity to enroll in this plan during your Welcome Meeting with FHS Human Resources.

PLAN	BENEFIT
Basic Group Life Insurance	175% of your annual salary.
Optional Group Life Insurance	25% to 500% (maximum option is 500%) of your annual salary.

VOLUNTARY ACCIDENTAL DEATH & DISMEMBERMENT INSURANCE (optional)

All Postdoctoral Fellows are eligible to purchase this optional insurance coverage. This plan covers members for 24 hours a day, each day of the year against death or dismemberment as a result of an accident anywhere in the world, whether on or off the job. The plan also pays for rehabilitation, occupational training, repatriation, and special education. The member pays the full premium for the coverage selected. For more information on coverage options and premium amounts please visit the Accidental Death and Dismemberment page on the Human Resource services site. You will have the opportunity to enroll in this insurance during your welcome meeting with FHS Human Resources.

TRAVEL BENEFITS

If you hold an appointment of 12 months or more, you are enrolled in emergency medical travel coverage under your Extended Health Care plan through Sun Life. This plan covers you and your eligible family members for all the services and supplies eligible under your group benefits plan, while travelling outside the province where you live — whether it is a business or personal trip. While travelling, if you require medical assistance you will need to contact Allianz Global Assistance for 24/7 assistance. This information is on your 'Travel Card' which you should receive during your Welcome Meeting with FHS Human Resources and is also available online through your My Sun Life account.

LEAVES, VACATION ENTITLEMENTS & HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Leaves Postdoctoral Fellows meeting requirements are eligible for the following types of leaves:

- Sick leave
- · Maternity, parental, and adoption leave
- General leave (without salary)
- Bereavement leave
- Compassionate care leave

All leaves must be approved by your supervisor. For more information, please speak with your FHS Human Resources representative.

Vacation Entitlements

Your vacation entitlements will be detailed within your letter of offer from Human Resources. All vacation plans must be arranged with your supervisor and taken prior to the end of your appointment.

Holiday Schedule

Please refer to the <u>McMaster University Holiday Schedule</u>. 'Holidays' are considered paid days away from work. Typically, employees of McMaster University receive time off for all statutory holidays and for the days between Christmas Day (December 25) and New Year's Day (January 1) inclusive. All time off must be approved by your supervisor.

INFORMATION FOR INTERNATIONAL POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWS

PDFs arriving from outside of Canada are responsible for obtaining the necessary documentation for admission to Canada, and the right to work at McMaster University. It is your responsibility to ensure these requirements are met prior to starting your postdoctoral appointment and are maintained throughout your time as a PDF at McMaster.

BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

OBTAINING YOUR WORK VISA/WORK PERMIT

Foreign Postdoctoral Fellows are required to obtain a temporary work permit in order to be employed or hold a trainee position at McMaster. Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) will normally issue a work permit to PDFs who are employed by and performing work at McMaster. Once you receive your letter of offer from Human Resources, you are encouraged to contact the Canadian Embassy in your home country for further details on obtaining a work permit. You will not need a Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) as Postdoctoral positions are LIMA exempt. For more details on how to apply and the application form please visit the Citizenship and Immigration Canada website.



In addition to a temporary work permit, citizens of some countries and territories will also require a Temporary Resident Visa (TRV). More information can be found on the <u>CIC website</u>.

Once the temporary work permit is approved, the Canadian Immigration Office will issue a letter approving the issuance of a work permit. At this point you may now finalize your travel and moving arrangements. Upon entry into Canada, you should have the following documents ready to assist the immigration officer in issuing a temporary work permit:

- Letter of approval from the Canadian Immigration Office
- Offer letter from McMaster University
- Proof of PhD
- Passport(s)
- Temporary Resident Visa (if applicable)

- Travel documents (e.g., airline tickets)
- Marriage certificate or Statutory
 Declaration of Common Law Union (if requesting a spousal work permit)
- Children's birth certificates (if applicable)

A temporary work permit will normally be issued for the dates outlined in the offer letter. However, there are other factors, such as passport expiry date, which the immigration officer will take into consideration when issuing a work permit. If applicable, a spousal work permit and visitor records for accompanying dependent children will be issued at the same time.

AFTER YOUR ARRIVAL

SOCIAL INSURANCE NUMBER



After your arrival, new foreign employees must apply in person for a Social Insurance Number (SIN) at their local Service Canada office. The SIN is a nine-digit number that is needed to work in Canada or to have access to government programs and benefits.

Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) regulations do not permit any employer to pay an employee who does not have a SIN. All employees are required by Service Canada to present their SIN card to their employer within 3 days of starting work.

You can use eServiceCanada to:

- request a call back about one of our programs by completing a Service Request Form;
- book an appointment for passport or biometrics services; or
- apply for a Social Insurance Number (SIN) online.

ONTARIO HEALTH INSURANCE



OHIP is a government-sponsored program which provides a wide scope of benefits for medical and hospital services for all eligible persons who will maintain a minimum residency of at least three months in Ontario. Coverage begins after three months of residency and does not depend on employment. Application for coverage should be made within 30 days of arrival in Ontario by visiting a Service Ontario location.

For all individuals entering Ontario for the first time and for those who are returning and whose OHIP coverage has lapsed, a University Health Insurance Plan (UHIP) has been set up to provide for basic health care coverage during the first three months. It is a mandatory program.

You will need to setup a bank account shortly after your arrival as your earnings will be deposited directly in the Canadian bank account of your choice. The major banks in Canada offer a full range of banking, investment and financial services.

Additionally, many large international banks have a presence here through a subsidiary, representative office or branch of the parent bank. For more information on banking in Canada, please visit the Canadian Bankers Association website.

Your existing driver's licence from another province or country will remain valid for 60 days after your relocation to Ontario. You must apply for an Ontario driver's licence within your first 60 days if you want to continue driving in Ontario. For information on how to obtain an Ontario driver's licence, including important information on required identification and supporting documentation, please visit the Ontario Ministry of Transportation website.




Please note that if your licence is in a language other than English or French, you will be required to provide a written English translation from a qualified translator.

EMPLOYMENT FOR INTERNATIONAL SPOUSES/PARTNERS

If you are accompanied by your spouse (including common-law partners), and provided your work permit is valid for at least six months, they will be eligible to apply for a spousal work permit, which allows the spouse to search for and take up employment in Canada.

Application for a spousal work permit requires proof of your relationship (i.e., a marriage certificate or a statutory declaration of common law relationship) and a copy of your work permit. If your spouse has no job offer at the time of application, they can request an open work permit which will allow them to accept any job (provided a medical exam has been taken if required for the field of work). INTERNATIONAL PDFS WITH SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN



International PDFs with a valid work permit may enrol their child in a public (Elementary or High School) free of charge as all Public schools in Ontario are free. We suggest you contact the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board prior to your arrival to ensure your children will be eligible to attend elementary or secondary school and to confirm what documents will be required upon registration.

The Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board (HWCDSB) oversees the separate school system in Hamilton, and offers a variety of programs including full-day kindergarten, French Immersion, Adult Education, and The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP). 
